

# Pack 23 Camp Rules

Everyone enjoys going camping in a nice and peaceful environment. To ensure that everyone enjoys their stay at camp, we have a few rules that we ask all adults and scouts abide by.

1. Adults, please do not curse, or raise your voice to the scouts or other adults. If your scout does not get up in time to go to an event, please let them miss the event. If you have to discipline your scout, please do it in a manner that will not disturb other campers.
2. All scouts are to be in their tents with the lights off by 10:00 PM unless they will be attending a night event, or the last event runs past 10:00 PM. We also ask all adults to be in their tents or very quiet after 10:00 PM. Remember that everyone in camp can hear what you say or ANYTHING that you do when you are in your tent.
3. If you have to go to the restroom after 10:00 PM, please do not shine your light into other scouts tents, and be as quiet as possible. Use your flashlights only when necessary. Please, no unnecessary talking. Please whisper whenever possible.
4. Please observe quiet time until 6:30 AM.
5. No adults of the opposite sex in the same tent unless they are married. No children of the opposite sex in the same tent unless they are brothers and sisters and have an adult relative in the tent with them. No child in a tent with an adult of the opposite sex unless the child is related to the adult. Breaking of this rule could result in the charter being pulled for the pack, and the pack no longer allowed to meet.
6. All fires must be built in a fire ring or otherwise approved by Cub-Master. There should also be a 6 foot area cleared around the fire with nothing that will catch fire. Dirt or non-movable grass only in the 6 foot area. When leaving the camp for an activity, the fire should be at a minimal burn. Nothing hanging over or above the fire ring. There should be no flames visible. You can use dirt or sand to smother the fire. Also, move all chairs and other items out of the 6 foot area. When leaving camp for good, all fires have to be cool to the touch. Absolutely no smoldering or warm fire rings. Use enough water to completely extinguish the fire.
7. All trash is to be removed from camp.
8. Remember, no trace left behind. Please leave with everything you brought.
9. A few extra things not allowed on camp: sheath knives, fireworks, alcohol, cigarettes, and bad attitudes.
10. This is not a complete set of rules for camp. These rules are in addition to the camp rules of the established camp for which you are attending. If there are any conflicts between these rules and the camp rules, the camp rules win.
